

You Made our First-ever Developmental **Disabilities Awareness Month (DDAM) Crowdfunding Campaign a Huge Success!**

CEL's first-ever crowdfunding campaign in March 2024 was a resounding success. It brought together the organization's community of members, members' families, volunteers, and CEL staff like never before. CEL leveraged a \$50K match from Vaughn Moore (Board of Directors) to raise over \$140,000! In total, CEL raised over \$190,000 in honor of Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month. The impact is even more significant when you consider that of the 935 donors who contributed to this campaign, 681 were new donors to CEL.

Perhaps most importantly, the bulk of the funds raised came through the fundraising pages of individuals, also known as "Ambassadors." These Ambassadors—mostly families of our members, CEL staff, and volunteers—created fundraising pages and joined teams to support the campaign. We would not have been so successful without the passion and commitment of our event Ambassadors and their willingness to share their love for CEL. The campaign concluded with a celebration at CEL for everyone who helped make it a success. We can't wait to do this again next year, even bigger and better!










Catalyst Life Skills Program

The brand new Catalyst Life Skills Program is designed to help support personal growth and independence of our members with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Focused on learning life skills, each session members focus on a new topic like meal planning and preparation to learning about community resources, personal safety, and in-home tasks.

Members have grown so much in their skills going to grocery shop for groceries and coming back to prepare their lunch meals with their friends. We are proud of the growth our members have seen in confidence, self-sufficiency, and life skills.



REACH

Our REACH members spend 70% of their time out and about in the community. Whether visiting museums, volunteering at Bernie's Book Bank, or exploring different cultures, they embrace every opportunity to connect and learn. Through the REACH program, CEL provides year-round community-based opportunities and activities for continued learning and growth for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities who have graduated from high school and are 18 years or older.

Employment

Every person deserves the chance to shine and contribute their skills and talents to the community. Sheerba A. is a great example of this. With support from CEL's employment program, he received job coaching that helped him secure his first paid position as a server assistant at Cooper's Hawk Winery and Restaurant.

There he is gaining hands-on experience in the culinary field and developing the skills he needs to achieve his dream of owning his own culinary business one day. He is a valued member of his team and currently receives job retention support through the Employment Opportunities Program.
