# ELSA Students

- Between 18 and 28 with a high school diploma or certificate
- Interested in developing skills in functional literacy, technology, employment, and independent living
- Must have:
  - Sufficient emotional skills and capacity for independence
  - Basic reading/comprehension, writing, and math skills



# Academics

- Increase student's literacy and technical skills and capacity for *writing, mathematics, purposeful reading, and reading for pleasure*
- Classes taught by ELSA faculty with Elmhurst University student teacher assistants
- ELSA students can take traditional Elmhurst University courses as ELSA electives which can lead to additional Certificate of Specialized Study
- Possibilities to transition to become an undergraduate

# ELSA Course Load

- Full Time Students – 4 classes per term plus Educational Coaching
- Part Time Students – 2 classes per term; Educational Coaching Encouraged
  - Each class = 1 credit
  - 32 credits needed for graduation



# ELSA Electives


Electives are chosen if **ELSA** student has:

# ELSA Housing

- Fully Inclusive
- Two Residence Halls with Community Advisors (CA) and Resident Advisors (RA)
- Two Residence Halls with RA support only
- Apartments without support



# ELSA Housing

- ELSA Community Advisors (CAs)
  - Live and work in the residence halls
  - Serve as role models and resources for students
  - Support students who live on campus by teaching independent living skills for social and academic success.
- Life Coaches (LCs)
  - Help students improve executive functioning skills and build independence

- 1 letter of recommendation from teacher or counselor
- Official High School Transcript
